A REVENUE-SHARING BILL

WASHINGTON - A revenue-sharing bill that would provide \$16,710,555 for Nevada in fiscal year 1977 is nearing Senate approval, Senator Howard Cannon has announced.

"Since its creation in 1972 revenue sharing has helped to relieve the fiscal problems of hardpressed local governments in Nevada and all over the United States," Cannon said in support of the program extension.

"I think it would be fair to credit revenue

sharing with providing means by which local governments survived the recent recession without decimating their principal base of support - the homeowner - through crippling pro-

perty tax increases.
"In returning control and administration of the money to State and local governments, revenue sharing is also a welcome departure from the all to common consolidation of everything in Washington that we have seen in recent years.

"The revenue sharing concept is a proper move in the right direction that recognizes the role of each level of government as a responsible partner in our Federal system. It has done much to return the decision making for dealing with local problems to local elected officials where it should be," Cannon said.
