## Turnovers & Penalties

Turnovers and penalties are two statistics which can really hurt a college football team and the 5-2 UNLV Rebels must correct this situation in a hurry. The Rebels of coach Tony Knap face the toughest four games of the 1976 season, and, thankfully, all of them will be played in the pleasant confines of 16,200-seat Las Vegas Stadium.

After losing last Saturday on the road on the final play of the game, 31-28 to Northern Arizona University, the shell-shocked and injury-riddled Rebels now are getting it back together to face rugged and undefeated Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo, who has mysteriously not appeared in the Division II national rankings this season.

Looking for the good things in a loss to help improve in all areas, the Rebels showed once again they can score, do have a running game (even if its just one person) and that All-America quarterback candidate Glenn Carano is healthy and as accurate as always.

Raymond Strong, the powerful junior speedster from Berkeley, Calif., had his second straight 100-plus game against NAU. Carrying a season high 21 times, he bulled his way for 121 net yards, including one 14-yard touchdown rumble. He now has toted the 'skin 79 times for 499 net yards for a 6.3 yard-per-carry average and six touchdowns. He has also caught 10 passes for 150 net yards and returned seven kickoffs an average of 28.6 yards each.

Carano has now made good on 103 of 191 pass attempts for a .539 completion rate good for 1,360 net yards and eight touchdowns.

His favorite targets continue to be senior Mike Haverty and sophomore Brien Harris. Haverty has caught 40 passes (four short of UNLV's single season record) for 574 net yards and three score while Harris has brought in 34 passes for 541 yards and three touchdowns.

While Haverty leads Division II in receptions per game 5.7, and Carano is second in pass completions (17.1 cpg), sophomore Henry Vereen continues to lead the nation, average 35 yards per kickoff return (14 for 490 net yards.).

### UNLV Wrestling Classic

Fifteen home dual meets with UNLV Wrestling Classic highlight the 1976-77 first-year UNLV intercollegiate wrestling season, recently announced by head coach Dennis Finfrock.

Finfrock, in his first full-fledged season at the helm of the Division I Rebel grapplers, feels that the schedule is as good as any first-year program. "This is my first season at UNLV and with the teams that we will be competing against, I am quite optimistic the UNLV

wrestling program is heading in the right direction," Finfrock said.

Not only is this UNLV's first season with an NCAA-recognized wrestling program, this is the first time in the state of Nevada there has been a collegiate wrestling team. Last season the Rebels competed as a club sport.

The UNLV Wrestling Classic will be held on November 27, and will feature such teams as University of Arizona, University of New Mexico and Cal State, Stanislaus.

The Rebels will face many of the top teams in the nation both at home and in tournaments throughout the season. Oklahoma State, a long-time national power in intercollegiate wrestling, will be in Las Vegas on January 2 for an exhibition match and followed by UCLA on January 3. UCLA is one of the top teams in the nation and has been among the top three West Coast teams for many years. Other top-rated teams that UNLV will host include, Stanford, Texas A&M, Utah State, and Hawaii.

The Rebels open the season on November 26 against Cal Lutheran College with a 3:30 p.m. match at UNLV.
