Petition in Opposition to Mal Nutrition

The Black inmates of Clark County Jail 4-F with petition stating and in opposition to insufficient diet. Black inmates here in jail awaiting trial are served 2 meals per day.

STATEMENT OF FACTS --

- A - Citrus fruit prepared as juice or other means are exempt from diet.
- B - Meats when served is less than 2 ounces per person.
- C - Lettuce or cabbage salad is spoiled from storage.
- D - Jello in it's various forms are served (5) five days per week as a desert.
- E - Bread is stored and always carries a bitter taste (2) two slices per person.
- F - Butter is served (2) two times per (7) seven days.
- G - (1) one-oz. of vegetables per person per day. (2) two-oz cup of milk per day (powdered).
- H. Many inmates suffer from bleeding gums and similiar ailments from lack of vitiman C.
- I - All inmates states here in this petition -- meals are served (12) twelve hours apart -- and have a nutritional deficit due to extremities of diet.
- J - On an average basis inmates who cannot make bail must withstand these nutritional deficiencies.
- K - We are not proposing segregation nor intergration of Blacks or any racial delination here in Clark County Jail. -- But we protest vehemently the many discriminations and the inadequate diet heaped upon the blacks group-ed here awaiting trail.
