The developments surrounding modern use of the harmonica are traced on a half-hour television essay, "Playing the Thing," Sunday, Nov. 14 at 3:30 p.m. and repeating Wednesday, Nov. 17 at 10 p.m. over TV-10.

Although the Chinese were playing their version of the harmonica over 2,000 years ago, it was not until the last few years, when harmonicas began to be manufactured from silver and space age plastics, that the instrument came into its own.

Classical, jazz, popular music and bluegrass are played on the harmonica during the program by Cham Ber Huang, Duster Bennett, Sonny Terry, Brian Chaplin, and others. Performances include solos demonstrating the versatility of the instrument, small groups playing different types of harmonicas, and a selection by an all-harmonica orchestra.
