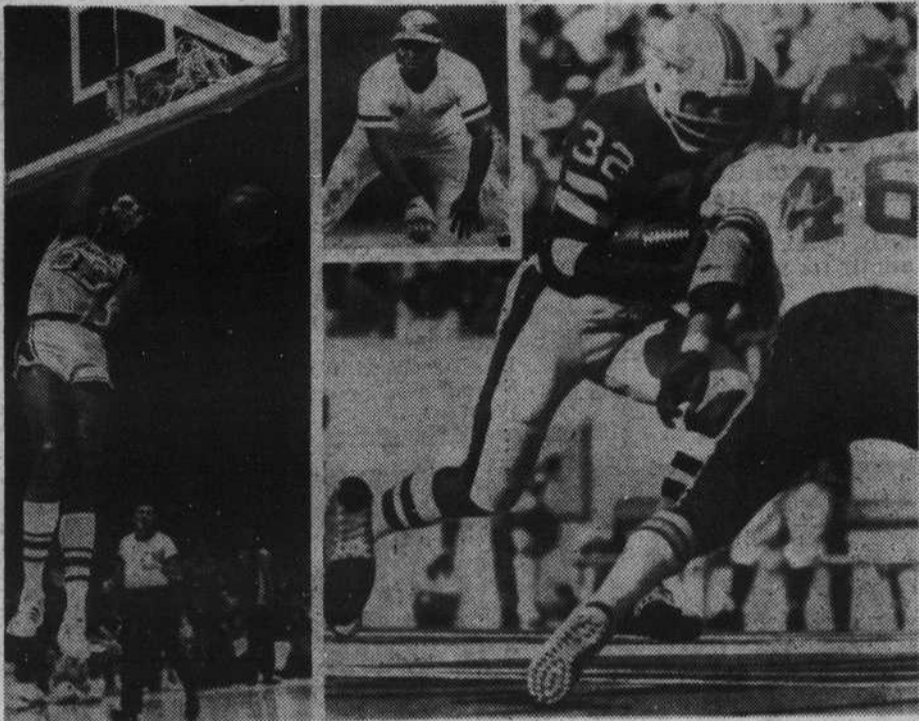

Highlight Film Available

DETROIT -- A new sound and color motion picture covering highlights of the first 10 years of professional football's Super Bowls is now available to local groups from Chrysler Corporation's free-loan, sports film library.

The exclusive 27-minute, 16 mm film captures all the great plays -- and some of the memorable misplays -- in Super Bowl history starting with the initial dominance of Vince Lombardi and the Green Bay Packers. The incredible New York Jets upset victory, the flashy Dallas Cowboys and the power and precision of the Miami Dolphins and Pittsburgh Steelers in their championship years are all recaptured in the film.
