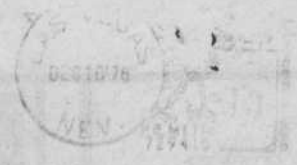

RUBY DUNCAN STICKS FOR OPERATION LIFE

The Nevada State Welfare Department was turned down by the Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County (EOB) Wednesday night regarding the trouble-ridden early screening program for children formerly run by Operation Life.

There was a motion made and acted on to refuse to let the Welfare Department dictate its policy.

Dr. James McMillan, chairman of the board before the closing, proposed that they could not only refuse contracts, but offer administrative assistance to the clinic to get it operating according to Federal Regulations.

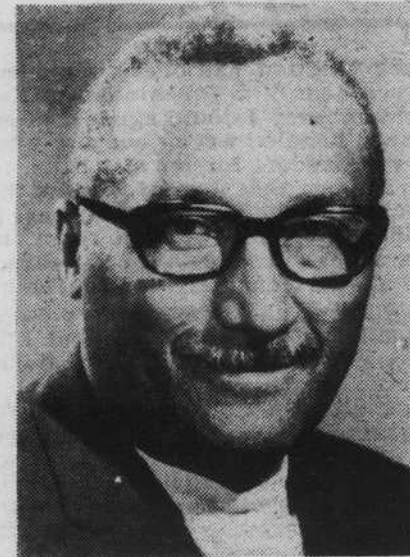
The Welfare Department said Operation Life had used fraudulent methods in filing out its medicaid papers.

Ruby Duncan, head of Operation Life took the Welfare matter to court after she was closed down.

The request is to be ruled on by District Court Judge Howard Babcock on December 20.

Duncan said it was hard to tell what would happen to the clinic in the meantime and she would try to get a ruling sooner than that.

Duncan said the Welfare Department had a vendetta against the women of Operation Life and said the clinic was closed to hurt them.
