UNLV Baseball Coach releases 61-game Schedule

LAS VEGAS, NEV.—UNLV Head Baseball Coach Fred Dallimore has released a 61-game schedule for the Rebels' 1977 season which includes 36 games at home and 25 on the road. The highlight of the aggressive schedule is a 10-day trip to compete in the Third Hawaii Invitational in Honolulu with USC, Kearney State, Florida State, and host University of Hawaii.

Dallimore, beginning his fourth season as the head Rebel baseball coach has 13 returning lettermen on his 25-man squad currently preparing for a season opening series on Feb. 18 and 19 when Brigham Young University comes to Las Vegas. The Rebels and the Cougars will play a single game at 1:30 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 18, and then come back with an 11:00 a.m. doubleheader on Saturday, Feb. 19.

UNLV was 31-25 last season, setting 27 school records in the process and Dallimore has once again given the Rebels a schedule which includes many of the top 20 teams each season. Flavored with Western Athletic Conference on the schedule, the Rebels will also play a single game at the University of California,

Riverside (Feb. 21) along with a six-day, five-game trip to Phoenix, Arizona (March 3-8) when the Rebels will meet Lubbock Christian twice, Grand Canyon College once and Arizona State University in two single games.

In Las Vegas, UNLV has games scheduled with Arizona State (March 14-15), the University of Wyoming (March 18 and March 20), Washington State (March 25-26), the University of Oklahoma (March 26), the University of California, Santa Barbara (March 27-28), Fresno State University (April 15 and 16), and the University of Hawaii (April 29-30). The Game of April 15 with Fresno State is the only night game lined up at home this season and will be played at 7:30 p.m. at Sunset Park.

The 35 other Rebel home games are slated to be played at the Unlv Campus Field.

Dallimore, the former All-America pitcher at the University of Nevada, Reno, has played challenging schedules and each year has improved his total. He has had seasons of 19-34 (1974), 23-25 (1975), and last year his team was 31-25.

UNLV Lady Rebels Defeat U. of Nebraska

In action over the weekend, the Rebels soundly defeated the U. of Nebraska at Lincoln Lady Huskers in one of the best games played at home this season. Despite a relatively low scoring average for the game (4.09), four Lady Rebels were in double figures, Debra Waddy with 17, Sheila Powell with 16, Belinda Candler at 15 and Anita Carter with 10.

Defensively, the Rebels showed marked improvement, going into an effective zone in the middle of the second half. They out-rebounded the Lady Huskers 64-42, led by Belinda Candler with 12 and Donna Wick and Debra Waddy with 8.

The team scoring average improved slightly with Saturday's victory and now stands at 89.8 per game. Waddy continues to lead the squad with 19.3 points per game. Candler has a 16.1 ppg average and co-captain Liz Galloway is averaging 10.4. Dominating the boards is Janice Fuller with an 8.3 rebounds per game average, followed closely by Candler with 8.1.

Two home games remain on the Lady Rebel slate. Utah State University will return for a rematch on Jan 29 and Weber State University of Logan, Utah will take on the Rebels on February 4.

MARRIAGE WORKSHOP TO BE HELD ON UNLV CAMPUS

A two-day workshop on marriage and family life will take place Feb. 1 and 2 in the West Lounge of the Moyer Student Union Building on the UNLV campus.

The workshop is being sponsored by the Department of Social Services in conjunction with the Division of Continuing Education on the campus.

The program will include topics of interest to counselors, ministers, educators, social workers and anyone in the social services field.

Dr. Herbert Otto, internationally known for his numerous books, articles and workshops on the subject of marriage, will be the speaker.

Chairman of the National Center for the Exploration of Human Potential, Dr. Otto specializes in the areas of human potential, family strengths, human sexuality and preventive programs in mental health. He is the author and editor of 14 books, including "More Joy in Your Marriage" and "The Family in Search of a Future."

Mrs. Dorothy Bryant, special program coordinator for the Social Services Department, said this was one in a series of workshops that will be sponsored by social services to meet the training needs of practitioners in child welfare and family service agencies. The workshops have been made possible by a grant from the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

The workshop offers one optional unit of college credit on a pass/no pass basis and a certificate of completion for those who attend the entire session.

Fee for the workshop is \$5 for non credit and \$18 for credit. A limited number of stipends covering the cost of the conference are available for employees in the local social service agencies, stated Bryant.

Enrollment in the workshop is being accepted now by the Division of Continuing Education at UNLV.
