representatives, 21; city council, 11; mayors, 2; county commissioners, 8; board of education, 15; judges, 2; coroners, 3; justices of the peace, 3; clerk of superior court, 1; county superintendents of education, 2; tax commissioner, 1; and vice mayor, 1.

In predominantly black Hancock County, blacks maintained a majority on the county governing board. William Alexander won his election for a judgeship in Atlanta.

LOUISIANA. Fifteen blacks were elected including the first black ever elected to the New Iberia city council. The total included five city council members, eight school board members, and two police jurors.

MISSISSIPPI. Of 31 victories, there were 17 election commissioners and 14 school board members. Eight were incumbents and the remaining 23 were new comers. In Port Gibson, where the NAACP is fighting a suit filed by local white businessmen, all black candidates of mayor and the city council lost.

NORTH CAROLINA. Thirty-five victories included: states senators, 2; state representatives, 4; county commissioners, 18; school board members, 9; and judges, 2. Howard Lee, former mayor of Chapel Hill, lost his bid for Lt. Governor.

SOUTH CAROLINA. A total of 67 victories included some historic breakthroughs. Elected were: state representatives, 13; county council members, 21; school board members, 26; sheriff, 1; coroner, 1; public service commissioner, 1; city council members, 2; mayor, 1; and superintendent of education, 1.

In Beaufort County, the first black elected to the county council in 1960 won reelection. Theodore McFarland, of Williamsburg County, became the first black sheriff elected in South Carolina in this century. Leroy Levy of Clarendon County became the first black superintendent of education. In Charleston County, incumbent Lonnie Hamilton was elected the first black chairman of the county council in the history of the state.

TENNESSEE. In this off-year for elections in Tennessee, Harold Ford of Memphis won reelection to the U.S. Congress and a black vice mayor was elected in Huntington.

TEXAS. Thirty victories included one Congressional Representative, Barbara Jordan of Houston, 13 state representatives, three justices of the peace, nine constables, and one for each of the positions of county commissioner, city council member, judge, and sheriff. All eight of the incumbent black state representatives were returned to office with moderate opposition.

Three newcomers were elected to the Texas state house: Clay Smothers of Dallas County, Ron Wilson of Harrison County, and Al Price of Jefferson County. Louie Hall became the first black sheriff ever elected in Stephen County and in the state in modern times.

VIRGINIA. Twenty victories included five mayors, 13 city council members, and two vice mayors. The mayors were elected in Roanoke, Fredericksburg, and Clifton Forge.

The Voter Education Project, (VEP), which compiled the year-end report on the election of blacks in the South, continues to operate programs of nonpartisan voter registration, citizenship education, technical assistance to black officials, and leadership development activities. VEP is supported by tax-exempt contributions from foundations, corporations, unions, religious organizations, and individuals throughout the United States.
