A—Apprenticeship or on-the-job training is available

to children; however, only spouses, widows or widowers may take correspondence courses.

Q—what is the 20-year endowment National Service Life Insurance plan?

A—This is a permanent-plan policy that provides life insurance coverage for 20 years. If the insured is alive at the end of the 20-year period, he may receive the full policy amount in one sum or installments. Premiums are higher than most permanent along.

Q—As an honorably discharged World War II veteran
am I eligible for educational benefits under the GI

A—Educational benefits for World War II veterans ended July 25, 1956. The current bill offers training to eligible veterans separated from active duty after January 31, 1955. Eligibility ends 10 years after

## The Program



The WIC program has openings for all eligible Medicaid persons. Who is eligible? All medicaid children under the age of five, all pregnant or nursing women also on Medicaid who have been seen to have nutritional need. If you feel you are eligible, this is not a program to pass up. It can provide you with high nutritious foods - milk, cheese, eggs, cereals, fruit juices. It helps your monthly food budget, makes you or your children healthy and much more able to have a good chance to lead a better life. Come to Operation Life at 400 West Jackson and bring your Medicaid card, children's birth certificates. If this is your first time on WIC, come in the morning.

The City of Las Vegas has given Operation Life \$10,000 to add to funds for renovation of our facility. If any of you have been here, you know how cold it is and how in need of renovation we are. It won't be but a few more months now and several of the floors will be

few more months now and several of the floors will be operable. We hope that community businesses will want to move in to the "Cove" and work together to make it the boulevard of the Westside. We hope to have social service type organizations here also and the entire effect will be good for our community.

Early Periodic Screening is still happening at the same location. It is available to all Medicaid children under 21 years of age and can prevent diseases and harmful changes in your child's body before it is too late. Early Screening can be received everyday week day. Call your worker and tell them you want a SAMI 25 form so your children can have a good health checkup. Screening will check your children's eyes, ears, heart, blood and overall to see if they are healthy. Referrals are made to private physicans if treatment is necessary. We recommend that every child eligible gets screened.

A national congressional hearing was held on EPSDT with Nevada's Congressman James Santini playing a leading role. The Committee determined that the EPSDT program "has the potential for being the most important long term, cost effective health care program currently in existence," and stresses one of the problems with the program is being the lack of interest on the part of state governments. The little money being spent on preventative care will save money being spent on preventative care will save millions in treatment. It will also save hardship for

families who suffer when their children are ill.

Get your children screened for preventative health care.

Its important that low-income women start thinking economics and thinking about different things they can do to get out of the rut they are in. They have to be thinking equality, jobs, training, education, small business and money. We have to overcome the whole welfare myth if we're going to have to be like "Chicken George" in Roots and get it together - do it better than anyone else - and know we can do it.
