

LAS VEGAS TRANSIT NEW MAIN STOP AND TRANSFER CENTER



Better and more convenient service for bus passengers in the Las Vegas area is promised with the announcement of relocation of the main stop and transfer center for the Las Vegas Transit System.

Effective Monday, Feb. 7, according to General Manager Barry Perea, all local routes will board on South Third Street, between Fremont and Carson.

The only exception, he said, will be Route 1 (Hyde Park) and Route 10 (University), which will board around the corner on Carson Avenue.

Three other routes, No. 3 (Salt Lake Highway), No. 4 (Boulder Highway) and No. 6 (Strip), will

continue to make additional stops on North Third Street as well as at the new location.

Another feature of the South Third Street stop

area will be a sales and information booth which will be located at 114 So. Third. This office, which will be open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., will which will be open from / a.m. to 11 p.m., will handle sales of commuter cards, tokens and school passes. Also, in a cooperative effort with the Downtown Progress Association, it will serve as a tourist information center. "This is the best location we have ever had to operate out of", Perea said. "It is our hope that it will provide added convenience for all of our passengers boarding and transferring

of our passengers boarding and transferring there."

Perea said the move is the result of co-operative planning by Las Vegas Transit, the Downtown Progress Association, Regional St-reets and Highways Department and the City of Las Vegas Traffic and Engineering Depart ment to bring about improvements in bus service to the community.

Perea also said that there is no change in the current fare structure, which is \$3.35 for a 10-ride adult commuter card, six tokens for \$2.40 and 70¢ for the adult cash fare. The cards and tokens may still be purchased from drivers or at the new location.


