
all Americans can feel secure in the knowledge that they have finally experienced this dream.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Following are representative questions answered daily by VA counselors. Full information is available to any VA office. Q -- I am currently on active duty but will be granted excess leave to attend school. Under the GI Bill will I be paid as a serviceman or

A -- An in-service student attending school under the GI Bill while on excess leave without pay, if otherwise eligible, may be paid educational assistance allowance at the rates payable to eligible external payable to eligible veterans.

Q -- Due to a financial emergency I am con-templating surrendering my National Service Life Insurance. I am hesitant to do this because
I have had this policy since World War II. Is
there any other avenue open to me?

A -- You may want to consider the option of

applying for a maximum policy loan. You can receive 94 per cent of the cash value. In addition, the policy will remain in force.

Q -- I am entitled to a grant for a specially adapted wheelchair home. I have my own home which is paid for, but would like to remodel it. May I use my grant for this purpose?

A -- Yes. A grant of not more than 50 per cent, up to \$25,000, may be used to pay part of the cost of building, buying or remodeling such homes or paying indebtedness on such homes already acquired. VA specialists are available to assist in obtaining services of an architect, obtaining construction bids and arranging necessary financing.
