90% of U.N.L.V.'s basketball team are black and for this reason I find it very shameful that the University would let the black community be treated in the manner in which they have and are being treated. We have been deprived of good tickets and seats for the Rebels games whether they be at home or on the road.

I don't feel that we blacks in this community have anything to be proud of because the only time they get a chance to see their own color is on TV, or up in the balcony of the convention center and anyplace else the Rebels play.

I was appointed to the Advisory Board of U.N.L.V., and out of all of my talking to the Dean and to the head of the University, I sincerely feel that U.N.L.V. is not a place for blacks to attend.

I see no need for me not being able to have a good seat in which to watch my son play basketball or football or any sport of the University.

I would ask to have a special meeting with the ticket controllers and the head of the University to seek a certain amount of fair seating and tickets for my people.

Once the Rebels get past Utah, they are looking forward to facing the Bruins. Of U.C.L.A. I support the Rebel basketball team because, after all, all we have playing are blacks, therefore, I have no other choice. Things are going to get better in Nevada because, next year I will see that blacks have their equal share of good tickets and seats.
