There is currently a bill before the Nevada Legislature called Assembly Bill 299 which can mean danger to poor people in relating to so called welfare "fraud". This bill states in so many words that a person who helps another person or a poor person who obtains assistance for health or remedial care to which he is not entitled or greater than which he is entitled shall be punished.

An example would be a poor person who by mistake or not receives over \$100 can be imprisoned by no less than 1 year and up to 6 years and possible receive a fine of \$5,000.

I can see the Welfare Department actually putting people into the position of receiving an extra hundred dollars of health or medical cared that the person needs, and then turn around and bring a "fraud suit" against the poor person. Don't put that beyond the welfare department.

Anyway, we can thank some of our fine legislators from Clark County who are on the Health and Welfare Committee for letting this type of bill get out of the committee and to the floor of the legislature. These state legislators on the committee consist on Marion Bennett, Darryl Dreyer, Jack Schofield, Lonnie Chaney, Bob Robinson, and Ian Ross.

I am quite sorry that the Clark County delegation that should know most about the needs of the poor children and seniors and poor women should support such a bill.

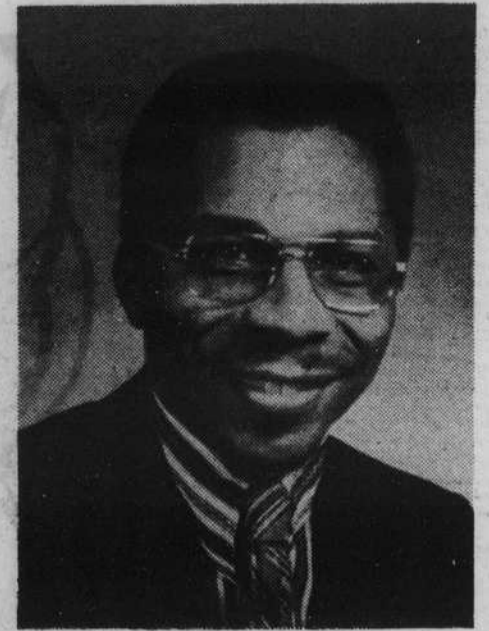
It's a shame that the welfare Division is never penalized for making mistakes and that it is always poor women and children and seniors who pay for the Department's errors.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Following are representative questions answered daily by VA counselors. Full information is available at any VA office.

Q -- I was given a bad conduct discharge from the Army. I was later granted a Presidential pardon. Am I eligible for VA benefits?

A -- A Presidential pardon does not change the character of a discharge, an administrative decision will have to be made. It is recommended that you file a claim for benefits. A transcript of the proceedings that resulted in your discharge will be obtained and a determination will be made. You should also apply for a review of your discharge by the Army Discharge Review Board.

Q -- My 20-year-old daughter is receiving dependents educational assistance and she plans to marry soon. Will her education be discontinued when she marries?

A -- If otherwise eligible, she may continue to receive the benefits.

Q -- May a veteran reserve grave space in a national cemetery?

A -- Any veteran whose separation from the service was for reasons other than dishonorable is eligible for burial in a national cemetery, but reservations are not accepted. Also, each veteran is entitled to only one gravesite. Other eligible family members must share the space with the deceased veteran.
