- 7. A perspective on their true abilities and needs which allows them to deal with transference - countertransference reactions realistically. An intuitive understanding for and empathy with with transference reactions.
- 8. Dual identity or a degree of it, or the capacity to imagine oneself in more than one role. -9- A sense of integrity, wholeness.
- 10. Lack of conscious and unconscious guilt in winning and surviving.
- 11. The ability to stand independently against the opinion of the majority but not be trivially rebellious.
- 12. The ability to put the understanding of what is true ahead of the need to be right.
- 13. The ability to yield, withdraw, or lose without being devastated.
- 14. The capacity for vicarious enjoyment of the success of others and to identify pleasurably with them. -15- A sense of humor

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Following are representative questions answered daily by VA counselors. Full information is available at any VA office.

- Q -- I am an Army retiree and waived my retirement pay in lieu of VA disability compensation. May I have an allotment withheld from my compensation check to pay premiums for a commercial insurance policy?  
A -- No.
- Q -- If my son enters the Air Force Academy, will he receive government life insurance?  
A -- He will be covered under Servicemen's Group Life Insurance unless he elects to waive his coverage.
- Q -- If a veteran is entitled to a one time VA car grant is he entitled to adaptive equipment for vehicles he may subsequently purchase?  
A -- Yes.
- Q -- May a veteran concurrently receive VA compensation and pension?  
A -- No. He would automatically be paid the greater of these two benefits.

**NOTICE OF APPRENTICESHIP OPPORTUNITY**

Applications will be accepted for the Painters and Tapers Apprenticeship Programs from May 16, 1977 through May 27, 1977.

We will be accepting seven (7) Painters, seven (7) Taper apprentices. The Painters course is three years in which you learn to become a professional painter. Instruction includes preparation, hanging vinyl, wallpaper, modern coatings and related activities.

The Tapers course is two years. You learn professional perfataper. Instruction includes care and use of dry-wall taping equipment and tools, dry-wall taping processes.

Each applicant must meet the following minimum qualifications:

- 1. Age 16 to 26 inclusive (Birth certificate required)
- 2. Education - High School or GED equivalent.
- 3. Citizenship - American or first papers.
- 4. Aptitude test - Color perception required for painters.

Each applicant who meets all minimum requirements will be interviewed by the Committee to determine his qualifications beyond minimum requirements. The interview will consider:

- 1. General education background
- 2. Aptitude test results
- 3. Physical ability as related to trade
- 4. Interest
- 5. Attitude
- 6. Personal traits

The Apprenticeship Standards provide that applications will be received without regard to race, color, religion, national origin or sex.

Applications will be accepted at 223 West Colorado Avenue on Monday through Friday during the period stated above from 8:00 A.M. to 11:30 A.M. and from 1:00 P.M. to 4:30 P.M.

CARSON CITY, April 3 -- Roy Dowling, chief of the Nevada Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation, announced the appointment of Dennis A. Selover as district manager of the Bureau's southern district with headquarters in Las Vegas.

Selover has been acting district manager since the retirement of Phil Palm last fall. Before that time he was a rehabilitation counselor and area supervisor for the Bureau's five offices in the Las Vegas district.

In 1968 Selover was named Counselor of the Year, both for Nevada and Region IX of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

He is a graduate of Idaho State University and is currently enrolled in the graduate program in Rehabilitation at the University of Nevada--Las Vegas.



**RUBY SAYS**

West Las Vegas and poor people could not have a better Senator than we have in Senator Joe Neal. He is one man that really cares and works for the people of his community. Many people on the other side of town couldn't say that their Senator fights for their wellbeing. Sen. Neal sponsored a bill that was killed by the Senate Finance Committee made up of those Senators who could care less about people. The bill would have allowed families with unemployed fathers to collect welfare-benefits. This would help prevent the father from leaving the home in bad times and help the family get back on their feet. In the long run it would be cheaper for the State not to perpetuate the welfare system and keep a mother with her children on the welfare rolls. With the father in the home, it would give the family a chance, and hold them together.

I would also like to congratulate M. Blackburn who wrote in answer to R. Bocock, in a letter to the editor of the Review Journal. Mr. Blackburn demonstrated for us beautifully the uniformed, unintelligent and highly prejudiced thinking of so many in the State of Nevada, and judging from Mr. Miller's statements and performance, I think he must also have demonstrated Mr. Miller's thinking quite well.

I'm not going to try too hard to disprove the ludicrous generalizations of Mr. Blackburn, but I can give a few illustrative facts. (1) Aid to Dependent Children (ADC), as the name implies, is designated to benefit children, not adults of any description, and unfortunately does that extremely poorly in this state. 2) there are very few jobs to be had as statistics prove and they are available often only if you are the right color, sex, age, etc., and of course, jobs for children, the blind, and disabled are even more scarce. Ask a few employers how many jobs they haven't been able to fill. 3) the food stamp program was designed specifically to aid producers and merchants of food and a large proportion of recipients are those who are working, but in low paying jobs. 4) George Miller has always pressured his employees, who are paid exceptionally well. (This can be documented), to be investigators, policemen and spies first and service workers secondarily. His reputation has been gained more by his policies of changing rules and making it inordinately difficult for workers to provide any service other than referral service to other agencies, than by his fiscal responsibility. It is hardly responsible to undermine established, purposeful programs costing the public immeasurably more in the long run. 5) Granted, Mr. Miller has superiors, some of whom are more politically than socially motivated, but the record shows that he has acted quite arbitrary and capriciously. He manipulates budgetary facts and figures and inflates program costs to levels unacceptable to the legislature.

Mr. Miller is no longer defensible as a Welfare Administrator in most people's eyes. He cannot be effective with so much animosity from important segments of the community--and from his own clients.

Mr. Blackburn, please keep talking. The poor people of Las Vegas need your help in showing Mr. Miller for what he is.
