In effect, this newspaper has said - Put up or shut up.



Exxon's Nuclear Threat

Exxon corporation may cause alarm with its proposed crush into a potentially chaotic field. This big oil entry into a potentially dangerous area should frighten even Congress into action. Exxon which has been a laggard in social responsibility, but a front runner in gasoline price hikes for the consumer is growing in a cancerous direction. Congress has not yet stopped the staid oil giant with an oil divestitute bill so its profits are going into controlling nuclear power.

Exxon corporation operates in the U.S. and in more than 100 other countries. Their activities include supplying nuclear fuel and develop-ment of uranium ore and coal. The company has coal reserves in the U.S. alone in excess of 8.4

The control of billions of tons of coal, over 4.7 billion barrels of crude oil and natural gas liquids, as well as, 26 billion cubic feet of natural gas apparently is not enough power for the Exxon corporation. Profits alone are enough to choke a horse. What more does Exxon want? The power to destroy life?

The Energy Research and Development Admin-istration recently played dumb when a fourth site for possible reprocessing of nuclear fuel was approved, selling about 185 acres near Oak

Ridge, Tennessee to Exxon Nuclear Co.

The Exxon corporation affiliate will at first use the acreage for storing spent fuel rods taken from nuclear power plants. Later, if the Nuclear Regulatory Commission is not looking, Exxon will build a plant for reprocessing reusable uranium and plutonium. ium and plutonium.

These rods are highly dangerous as they are still radioactive. The irresponsibility revealed in Exxon's social responsibility toward women. minorities and consumers does not leave them to be trusted in the public's interest of life

and death matters. INSULT TO INJURY

The profit motive being pushed by Exxon corporation as its excuse for excess fuel charges is weak in the face of current daily gasoline price increases.
