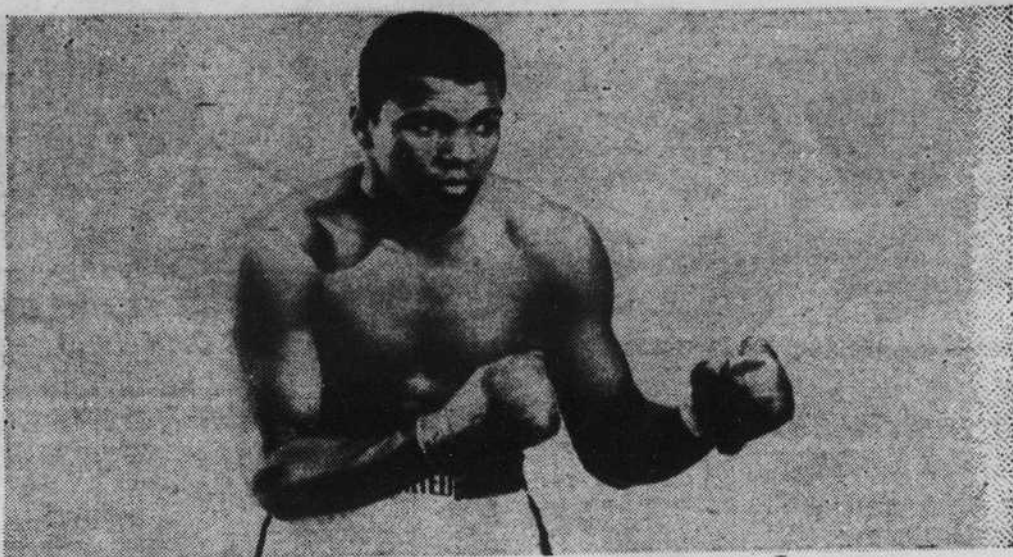


OOOOPS COMMITTEE GOOFS



ALI: ELLIS OR ELSE! . . . Muhammad Ali insisted that Champions Committee correct blunder and include former WBA champ Jimmy Ellis in Awards Show at Aladdin May 20. ALI WON!

JIMMY ELLIS JOINS EX-KINGS

When the Champions Committee for Cerebral Palsy invited Muhammad Ali and the living ex-heavyweight champions to receive their honors during the May 20th show at the Aladdin, the name of former WBA champ Jimmy Ellis was inadvertently left out.

And who do you suppose corrected this blunder? The current champ, the one and only Muhammad Ali!

After receiving press clippings on the event, "The Greatest" called executive producer Harry Bloomfield with a proposition he couldn't refuse:

"When I left my throne in '68 Jimmy Ellis proved he was great He beat Jerry Quarry in 15 at Oakland And if he ain't in Las Vegas on May 20 'The Greatest' may spend that night in Hoboken".

The record book discloses that Jimmy Ellis whipped Jerry Quarry in a 15-round bout at Oakland, California on April 27, 1968, to gain the WBA world heavyweight crown. And he held that title until Joe Frazier ko'd Ellis on February 16, 1970 for the undisputed world heavyweight championship.

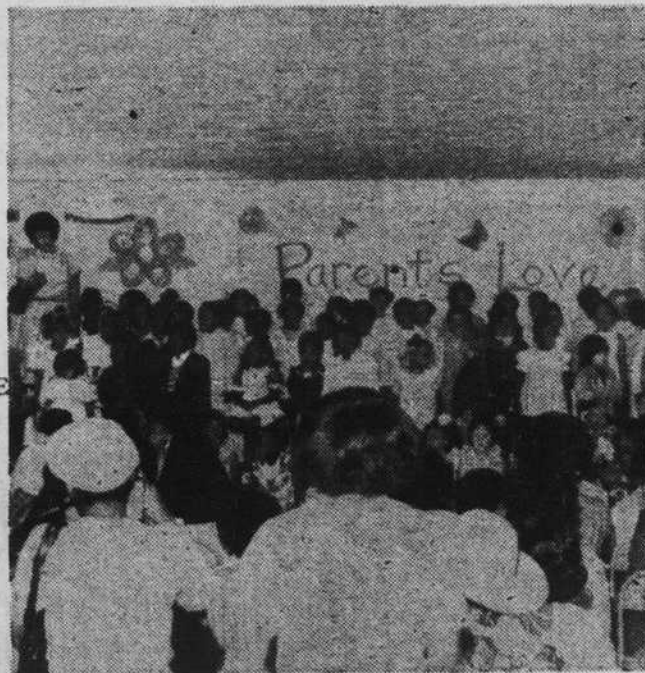
