 accepted and refused at such banks in Pennsylvania as Industrial Valley Bank and Provident National Bank. Congress should consider extending the Equal Employment Opportunity Council jurisdiction to bring about justice for black students destined to be a part of the labor market.

In the meantime, blacks are not unaware of the institutional racism running rampant in the banking system. The Urban Bankers Coalition of Delaware Valley, (UBCD) Post Office Box 7619, Philadelphia, Pa. 19101, Eugene, is an organization of black banking personnel who are willing to serve our people in the state of Pennsylvania.

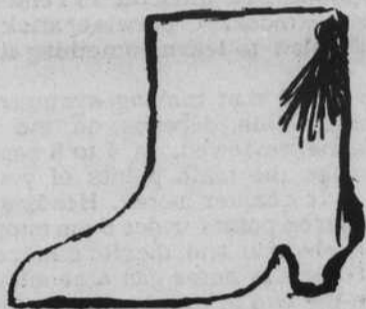
A Bruce Crawley, v.p., First Pennsylvania Bank is president of UBCD. While the black bankers in Philadelphia are just beginning to develop a black owned bank, their positions are high enough to secure a government approved loan for a student.

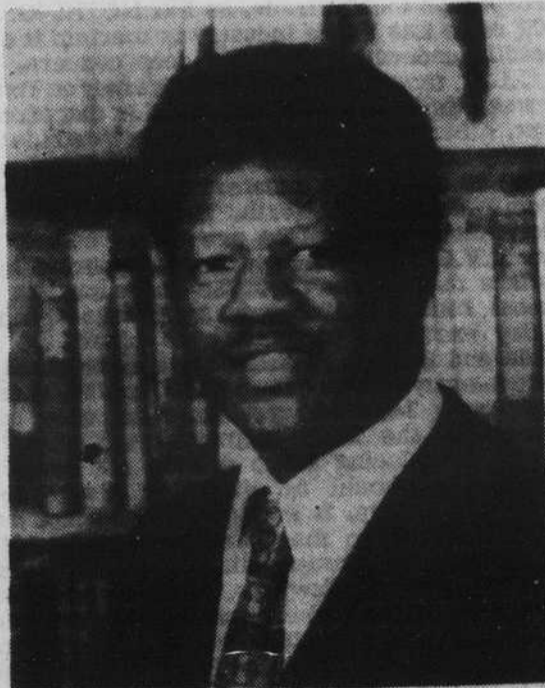
**NAACP
