In addition to the traditional classes, a number of courses are offered under the heading of Individualized Instruction or Open College.

The following is an explanation of these two concepts.

### INDIVIDUALIZED INSTRUCTION

An individualized course is designed in self-pacing unit that are based on specific task activities, and that take into consideration individual differences in background, experience, motivation and other factors affecting learning. A student is allowed to attain a level and function at a pace commensurate with his/her ability and within reasonable limits and restraints.

Our individualized lab courses are designed to be completed within one semester. You work at your own pace, spending as long or as little as you need within the semester to master your program. An added advantage of the program. If you have been making satisfactory progress, but have not completed your objectives, you may request an additional semester in which to finish. If, on the other hand, you complete the course, this enables you to spend more time pursuing other studies.

### OPEN COLLEGE

Many of the individualized courses are offered in the Open College concept, wherein you may pursue your program of instruction during any of the time periods designated for the specific course. The Open College concept also allows for registration in a course at any time there is space available you do not have to wait for a new semester. Students enrolled in these courses must report to the program laboratory within 15 calendar days after registration.

### SUMMER REFUND POLICY

Seventy-five percent refund only shall be made to individuals withdrawing during the first week of the five week sessions or the first two weeks of the ten week session.
