EDITOR'S NOTE: Following are representative questions answered daily by VA counselors. Full information is available at any VA office.

- Are there VA education loans available to assist a child receiveing dependents education assistance?

A -- If the child is enrolled at least on half-time basis, he may borrow up to \$1,500 per acadamic year to purseu a standard college degree program or if enrolled in a professional or vocational objective program requiring at least six months for completion. Financial need is a requirement. The current rate of interest is 7 per cent.

Q -- Isn't there a new provision in the VA pension law which pays an increased amont for older veteran?

A -- Veterans 78 years of age or older on VA pension rolls are entitles to an additional 25 per cent increase for all current law pension rates.

- - What is a continjent beneficiar y for my Q - - What is a consultance? Veterang Group Life Insurance?

A -- A contingent beneficiary is designated to receive the insurance proceeds if the principal beneficiary dies befor the insured.

Q -- I wear a prosthetic device due to a service connected disability and have recently heard that I may be eligible for a clothing allowance from the VA. Is this true?

· Veterans who, because of a service-connected disability, wear prosthetic devices which may wear out their clothing, or who use wheelchairs, are eligible for an annual \$190 clothing allowance.

Q -- I received \$2,000 disability severance pay from the Army. I applied for disability compensa-tion from the VA and my service-connected disa-bilities were rated at 20 per cent. When will I begin to receive disability compendation?

A.-- Before you may begin receiving compensa-tion from the VA, an amount equal to the amount of severance pay you received must be recouped. At the present 20 per cent rate of \$70 per month, it will take 29 months.

Q -- When I signed up for the GI Bill, I had my VA checks sent to the school. I now want my checks sent to my home. May I have this done?

A. -- Yes. Any VA office can assist in changing an address for receipt of benefit checks.

The Hughes Report

Few things nurse the soul satisfaction quite like a graduation. Saturday we went to the Aladdin Theatre to see Mrs. Mabel Hoggard receive the 'Distinguished Nevadan' title and award. Nothing could have kept my wife and I from that momentous event. Add this to the Distinguished Service Award bestowed upon her by the school district and the naming of one of its elementary schools 'Mabel Hoggard' School and you get a bird's eye view of this exceptional woman - a Nevada jewel. Mrs. Hoggard be-came the first black school teacher in 1946 and was hired for onr year without a contract in the old Westside School. She came to Las Vegas after having been a principal in Kent-ucky and West Virginia but had earned a Bachelor of Science Degree Cum Laude from Bluefield State Teachers College in West Virginia and had done post graduate work at the Univerof Chicago, and the University of Southern California, Los Angeles as well as University of Nevada, Las Vegas. Mrs. Hoggard has been on the Executive Boards of the NAACP, Las Vegas Community Concert Association and the Southern Nevada Teachers of English and Foreign Languages and week mides as the contract of th eign Languages and was twice secretary of the Clark County Chapter of the America n Red Cross and tresurer ofthe Las Vegas Classroom Teacher's Association. Graduating with distinction was Patricia Ann Bailey, Social Services and Social Science. There were approximately five blacks graduating in Bachelor of Science, 10 in College of Education, 5 in Hotel Administration, 10 in the Graduate College of Education Science, Arts. Graduation is the ending of one phase of training providing the graduates a chance to go out and get the liberal or street education but rest assured you must have that degree to be able to pursue the better jobs and get the more rewarding life. The 10 graduating in Business Administration seems to indicate a trend among blacks in the right direction. There is nothing black business needs as much as administrators. The growing and expanding white business some 15 years ago began tapping the black resources since there was not enough whites. Black campuses were swarming with white job recruiters and it was afeather in the cap of a recruiter who brought in a black executive type. In addition to this affirmative action made it mandatory that many firms get some blacks in higher positions, all of which has made it difficult to get trained blacks in black businesses.
