SENIOR HOME MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR PROGRAM AND SMALL APPLIANCE REPAIR PROGRAM IN FULL SWING

The Nevada State Division for Aging Services has awarded Title III Funds to the Steelworkers Old Timers Foundation, Southern Nevada Chapter and Small Appliance Repair Program.

This home repair program is available to seniors and whose income is not more than \$400.00 a month for a single senior, and \$635.00 a month for a couple. Crews are dispatched at Senior Homes equipped to handle most minor plumbing and other chores. The small appliance repairs are available to all seniors over 60 who fall in the income guidelines.

Both of these services are available to Seniors for no labor costs, with the grant picking up these expenses. The Senior does have to pay for any parts involved with the repairs.

Yet, during the month of April, with over 100 work orders completed, the average cost of a part to the Seniors participating in the program, was only 75¢.
