COLLEGE PLANETARIUM SEARCHES FOR LIFE BEYOND THE EARTH

The chemicals that form the Earth--the chemicals that form our bodies are spread throughout the universe. The chemicals of life are everywhere. Could there be then, somewhere, other beings on other planets who scan the heavens, wondering if they are alone in the universe?

This is the subject of 'The Loneliness Factor,' the new star program at the Community College Planetarium. As we search for life on the other worlds, we must wonder: What would they look like? Could they travel to the Earth? Could we understand their messages?

'The Loneliness Factor' was developed under a grant from the American Chemical Society and W. R. Grace and Co., by the Hansen Planetarium of Salt Lake City. In the months to come, about 300 planetariums across the United States will present 'The Loneliness Factor.'

Join the search for life beyond the Earth at the Community College Planetarium. 'The Loneliness Factor' will be performed free of charge every Wednesday evening at 7:30 p.m. through July 27th.
