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Head Start Recruitment

Recruitment for September 1977 Head Start Classes is now underway. Children who will be 4 years old on or before September 30, 1977 and are from low-income families are eligible to attend the Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County's Head Start Program. Applications will be taken during the months of June through August. Head Start opportunities will be open to 185 children, beginning in September.

To enroll your child in Head Start, complete an application form at the EOB, 1818 Balzar Avenue. Hours are from 8 A.M. to 12 Noon and from 1 P.M. to 5 P.M. daily, Monday through Friday.

When applying, you will need a copy of your child's birth certificate, immunization records (records of your child's shots, if available) and proof of income for the past year (either an Income Tax Statement, W-2 Form, a letter from ADC, paycheck stubs, or a letter from the Employment Security Department).

The Head Start family and income guidelines are for a family of one, \$2,970; two, \$3,930; three, \$4,890; four, \$5,850; five, \$6,810; six, \$7,770; seven, \$8,730; eight, \$9,690; nine, \$10,650; ten, \$11,610; eleven, \$12,570; and twelve, \$13,630.

Head Start offers a basic preschool experience for children with an overall goal of bringing about greater degrees of social competency. The program is funded by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Office of Child Development.

Every child and his/her family is provided with the five-part Head Start Program.

This Program includes education and training, nutrition, health care, parent involvement and social services.

Head Start classes are taught in 10 classes of 15-20 children each. Classroom activities and field trips introduce the children to the world around them. Self-esteem, self-confidence and self-reliance are encouraged to help the child develop a positive self-image. Language development is also stressed.

Head Start is mandated by Congress to have 10% of its total enrollment consist of children with special needs. The staff has received special training in this area to provide the best service possible.

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Children learn more readily when they are not hungry. A mid-morning snack and a Class A hot lunch are included in the daily program. Nutrition education is included for both the children and their parents.

Good health is essential to good learning. Before a Head Start child "graduates", he/she will have received a screening test (including tuberculin, hemotocrit, urinalysis, vision testing, hearing testing, complete physical examination, dental examination and sickle cell testing), in addition to all necessary immunizations. Any existing problems will be remedied through whatever medical or dental treatments are necessary.

Head Start parents are involved in all aspects of the Program. Parents assist in planning the Head Start Program and in working on community issues that affect them and their children. The key to a successful Head Start Program hinges on the fact that parents must be involved in the education of their children. Thirty percent of the Head Start teachers are former Head Start parents.

The fifth and final part of the Head Start Program is social services. Services are provided in the areas of employment, money management, protective health care, family planning, education training, strengthening individual and family functions, referral to community agencies for service when needed and explaining the functions of the Head Start Program and the role of the parent.

LAS VEGAS - For almost a decade music audiences have been trying to figure out what they would find if they could read Gordon Lightfoot's mind. MGM Grand audiences will get the opportunity to try when the "traveling folksinger" opens in the famed Celebrity Room with comedian David Steinberg on July 14.

Though he has given himself the folksinger title, since his first hit single "If You Could Read My Mind" in 1969 he has been one of the most contemporary singer/song writers of our time.

The native-born Canadian has written over 400 songs in his 12-year career. Those tunes most based on personal experience, have been recorded by such stars as Elvis Presley, Barbra Streisand, Johnny Cash, Bob Dylan, Glen Campbell, Jerry Lee Lewis, Ann Murray, Judy Collins, and Peter, Paul, and Mary.

His hit recording include "Early Morning Rain", "Cotton Jenny", "For Lovin' Me", and "The Last Time I Saw Her".

Since David Steinberg's first appearance on the Tonight Show in 1970 and a subsequent stint as Johnny Carson's replacement for an evening, he has become one of the most popular comedians and sought-after "guest hosts" on television.

After that appearance as the youngest host of the Tonight Show, he substituted for Dick Cavett and David Frost, and regularly co-hosts the Mike Douglas Show.

In 1972 his album "Booga Booga" was nominated for a Grammy Award as the Best Comedy Album of the Year.

Gordon Lightfoot and David Steinberg will be appearing in the Celebrity Room nightly at 8 p.m. and midnight through July 20.

Mr. Steinberg's special engagement will carry through until August 3.
