Eight ways to save power & money this summer

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Use exhaust fans. Push heat and humidity safely outside by using exhaust fans in kitchen, laundry, bath.

"Button Up." When indoor air is cooler than outdoor temperature, make sure all doors and windows are closed. Also, close off unused rooms during

"Cover Up" by using drapes to prevent direct sun from entering and heating house. Also, shade windows that get

Plan your "warm" activities. Do laundry, dishwashing, ironing in off-peak hours, like early morning or late evening. You'll be more comfortable.

Turn off lights and other appliances that generate heat (TV, stereo, etc.) except when actually in use.

Use freezer and refrigerator efficiently. They will run less, pump less air into room if you open these appliances as little as possible and keep their condensing units dust-free. New gaskets around doors will make a big difference.

Close off "hot spots." When kitchen, laundry, water heater are behind closed doors, other rooms stay cooler and drier.

Weather-strip doors and windows. Caulk cracks in outside walls and foundation. Close fireplace damper when not in
