2. From your own experience with growing urban problems, what benefits do you feel may be gained from the Algerian and Cuban experimentation with the building of "intermediate-sized" communities? How would (or could) urban services be greatly extended in this way, withour the attendant problems from urban overcrowding? You may find it helpful urban overcrowding? of your answer.
3. In what specific ways are Americans reportedly involved in black Africa's internal political struggles? (Your answer need not reflect a political bias. It is to be based upon only the major current news reports from the black African nations. Ideology should not


enter academicaly-oriented presentations.)

4. In what specific ways are other nations challenging the United States for substantial influence in Africa? How, in your view, might this affect the future course of the black African drive for full self-government? (Here again, the practice of listing your points will help to clarify your logic and so sharpen your capacity for clear analysis.)

5. What are some of the pluses and minuses of the Carter Administration's policies toward blacks? Can you list six developments in each category? Please answer your question as though asked directly or personally by Pre-

sident Jimmy Carter.
6. Can you list 10 blacks, together with their cities, who have served as mayors during the past decade? What do you see as the specific advantages of having black mayors? What suggestions do you have which may be helpful to present and future black mayors in the rehabilitation of our cities?

7. What are some of the signs of continuing racial change and unrest in our country? In what ways is such change needed? Do you feel that some unrest will always accompany change? Why so or why not?
