Senior Citizens

CARSON CITY -- Nevada's senior citizens will benefit from legislation passed by the 59th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

Effective July 1, persons age 70 or over are no longer required to renew their drivers licenses every two years. The new law allows senior citizens to renew their drivers licenses every four years along with all other Nevada drivers.

Sharon Alcamo, head of the Drivers License Division for the Department of Motor Vehicles, said that senior citizens must retain their present licenses until they are due for renewal. At that time, seniors may renew under the four-year program. A license may be renewed up to 90 days prior to expiration of a license.

In addition to the extended license period, Nevada's older residents will be receiving special consideration on their drivers license fees.

Ms. Alcamo noted that persons age 70 or older will be required to pay only \$3.00 for their drivers licenses and photo rather than the customary \$6.00 fee. The \$3.00 fee includes one dollar for the photograph on the license.

Ms. Alcamo added that senior citizens are still subject to the standard late penalty fee and reinstatement fee in cases of suspension, revocation or cancellation.

Physical examinations are now available for a small fee to persons 60 years of age and over through the Seniors Health Program at the Clark County Health Center.

According to Evelyn McColl, Director of Nursing, the physical examination is given by a nurse practitioner under a doctor's supervision and includes urine and blood tests, chest X-Ray and glaucoma test.

The Seniors Health Program, funded through the State Division of Aging, is trying to reach people in generally good health, but with minor complaints. The goal is to promote good health.

Appointments are available Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Health Center at 625 Shadow Lane.
