uring in the white family structure. Any administration employment program must gear itself for this new type of full employment situation.

Unemployment is further complicated for colored minorities because of illegal workers in the country. In the estimates prepared by the Immigration Naturalization Service (INS) illegal aliens hold about 3.8 million jobs. If just half those jobs were held by U.S. workers it would sharply reduce the nation's unemployment figures.

There is, however, no consensus that blacks or white women are the least bit interested in picking cotton or other crops in place of these people. The curx of this argument is that some of the most aggressive illegal alien hiring is done by service and light industry. To most illegal entrants, U.S. wage is a princely sum.

Some of these illegal aliens are whites from Canada and not so easily detected with your usual stereotype stare. In the Detroit area, clearly a third are from Canada. The Carter administration cannot contain this crazy condition without clapping down on the small white owned cheap labor industries.

In Germany, a special commission recommended penalties for employers of illegals at \$20,000 and five years in jail. Enforcement and a doubling of this penalty might push over the border employment figures straight down. The skill with which the Carter administration cares for the country's people of color will reveal his contribution to the nation.

Chicano, Puerto Rican and Black high unemployment must be reduced in spite of the current changes in national and international social and economic systems.

CULTURE

June 8th and 9th marked the beginning of what may be a new era of increasing Black pride and interest in the development of our rich culture. It was on those dates that community representatives of the arts attended a two-day panel and workshop at the "D" street Library to discuss culture in West Las Vegas.

Made possible through a grant from the Nevada Humanities Committee, the panel and workshop addressed the question - "Should Planning for the Arts in West Las Vegas be done separately from the rest of the community or should it be done with regard to the Greater Las Vegas Community as a Whole?"

Representing various viewpoints on the subject were panellists Pat Marchese - City of Las Vegas and the Allied Arts Council, Bill Ludwig - Westside Library and "D" Street Plus, Lyle Jones - Bold Explosion, Inc., Maudra Jones - WCCEDP, and moderator Don Karns - Socialist U.N.L.V. Keynote speaker

of the unique cultural forum was Lois McGuire, "City Spirit" facilitator from the National Endowment for the Arts, who led discussions on what the community wants culturally in West Las Vegas. Lois is executive director of Karamu House, a Black cultural arts complex based in Cleveland, Ohio.

During the two-day workshop residents made known their desires for new and better cultural projects, expressed the need for broader cultural programming, and discussed the feasibility of a total cultural arts facility in West Las Vegas.

As a result of the "City Spirit" facilitation and workshop and ad-hoc steering committee was appointed to analyze data, present the committee's findings, and submit recommendations for a cultural development plan as well as information on how the community may play a larger role in the Las Vegas cultural scene.
