KVVU-TV 5 will air the premiere telecast of the "Fourth Annual Presentation of the of the "Fourth Annual Presentation of the Black Athletes Hall of Fame Awards." The 90-minute entertainment extravaganza to be telecast on August 9th at 8-9:30 P.M. is hosted by Bill Cosby and was taped at the New York Hilton on June 16 when the eight

1977 inductees were honored.

In a special message delivered for the program by President Jimmy Carter, he says, "Sports more than any other facet of American life has led the battle for racial formula in this country, we all owe a equality in this country . . . we all owe a great debt to the talent, integrity and determination of the great black athletes of the 1930's, 40's and 50's whose efforts and sacrifices made sports open its doors to people of all races."

Those athletes honored in the 1977 Hall of Fame include: Dick "Nightrain" Lane, a member of the football All Pro Team for three years straight; Nell C. Jackson, a leader in the fight for both blacks and women in sports, and the First Black Woman on the Board of Directors of the U.S. Olympic Committee; Wendell Scott, the first Black Professional race car driver; Edward Stanley Temple, coach of two consecutive Olympic Temple, coach of two consecutive Olympic Teams, 1960, 64, and Head Coach of Women's track and Field for the USA, who also serves on the US Olympic Committee for the past five Olympiads; Wilt Chamberlain, Basketball Star; Larry Eugene Doby, Big Leaguer slugger from 1947-59, the first Black to play in the American league; O.J. Simpson, Football Star and actor; Ike Williams, Lightweight Boxing Champion of the World from 1947-1951.
