Mural Project

A mural utilizing a design by two local artists, Velvet Saleem and Rudean Gatson, based on a West Africa motif, is currently underway at the EOB West Las Vegas Community Center located at the corner of "D" St. and W. Washington. Bob Beckmann, professional artist, is supervising the art mural project implemented by youth through the Economic Opportunity Board (EOB) Youth Council.

The West Las Vegas mural project is sponsored by the City of Las Vegas Cultural Services Department and EOB. This is the first public art mural to be initiated since the completion of the Artist-in-School Program in June that included murals at the downtown library, fire alarm station, Dula Center, Phil Mirabelli Center and Western High School. Forum

Gwyn Brown, Bessie Braggs, and Otis Harris, representing the West Side Economic Development Plan and the Executive Board of "D" Street Plus, will take part in the public forum on the future of Las Vegas, September 16 and 17 in the Convention Center.

Titled COMING SOON: Las Vegas/Big-City Problems, the forum will study what might be in store for residents and visitors to the Vegas Valley area.

This two-day forum -- which is open to the public -- is being sponsored by the Las Vegas chapter of the American Institute of Architects through a grant from the Nevada Humanities Committee.

In addition to speakers from various parts of the country, the forum will present round-table discussions, workshops and audience-participation sessions. In fact, according to the director of this project, Estelle Kulwin, one of the most important parts of the forum will be feedback from the public.

Among the distinguished speakers will be Patricia Roberts Harris, a member of President Carter's cabinet, Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). She will talk about urban development planning at the national level, including funding and federal priorities.

Gwyn Brown will be a member of the first-day panel on "Cities and People." This forum will look at the future of our region in relation to human needs, to the possible need for cultural enclaves, to the disastrous effects of high-rising dwellings, and will explore the urban conditions that cause alienation.

Ms. Braggs will serve as a workshop resource person in the discussion of solving Big-City problems.

Otis Harris will join a panel responding to Patricia Roberts Harris' federal planning discussion, along with a Las Vegas management analyst, a consultant on neighborhood councils and a mortgage company executive.

Other directors of this public forum include architect Ed DeLorenzo and Dr. John Unrue, acting dean of Arts and Letters at UNLV.

Sessions will begin each of the two days with registration at 8:30 in the morning followed by a forum. An 11 a.m. break, with a no-host open bar available, precedes the luncheon (optional) and the afternoon workshops.

Registration

Students who have not changed their address since last May should receive a registration packet in the mail. Any student who does not receive a registration packet by August 22 should call the school.

Students new to Clark County and those who have moved over the summer should call their junior high as soon as possible between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Although formal registration is scheduled for September 1 and 2, it is extremely important that new students contact their school as soon as possible.

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Registration

Children who are five years old on or before September 30, 1977, are eligible to enter kindergarten this fall and should enroll at the school in the zone in which they reside.

All kindergarten enrollees should be accompanied by a parent or an adult who is conversant with the child's birthdate, status and history of health, and other personal information. It is imperative that every kindergarten child seeking enrollment present a birth certificate or other satisfactory proof of age (hospital certificate, baptismal record, or passport).

Experiences and events of the first day and first week of school are important. They are determining factors toward the child's success in this, his first year of school. The child who is deprived of a proper enrollment and orientation to the school program is at a great disadvantage. Planning, organizing and implementing enrollment and orientation are a responsibility of the school principal, with the teachers.



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
