Continued from page 2 column 3 number of board of directors seats. When these companies are cut into marketing, production and refining arts, then perhaps these less pestigeous positions will not tempt them to tap the till.

The Korn, Ferry International study also found that board of directors compensation has been rising rapidly. It now averages about \$100 an hour for outside directors in major companies. The money is increasingly paid whether or not many attend meetings. Among companies paying both annual compensation and a per-meeting fee, average remuneration last year was \$10,190.

A lot more than the poverty level of \$5,400.

Twenty-four corporations with sales of more than \$3 billion paid outside directors, an average fat annual income of \$15,320

The smallest of the five largest oil com-panies expects revenues of about \$18 billion for 1977 and Exxon is bucking for better than \$55 billion this year. The arithmetic might average out to \$51,500 per year per seat on its board of directors.

Sitting on one of these big oil companies board is like holding down a middle class in the search of the search o

job for life no matter what you say. Capitalism puts a lot of power in the hands of a few, and whne the hands get out of contraol it's time to call in the government.
