CC Legal Services Program

Clark County Legal Services Program is accepting applications for seats on its Board of Directors. Organizations and groups interested in a seat on the Board are encou-

raged to apply.
Clark County Legal Services Program provides legal assistance in civic matters to low-income residents of Clark County. Clark County Legal Services Program is funded by the Legal Services Corporation, court filing fees monies and the United Way of Southern Nevada. Under a grant from the Nevada Division for Aging Services, CCLSP also conducts the Senior Citizens Law Project.

In keeping with Legal Services Corporation regulations, Clark County Legal Services Program By-Laws require that fifteen members of its twenty-five member Board of Directors must be attorneys. Attorney members of the Board may represent client organizations, bar associations, neighbor-hood groups, anti-poverty groups and civil

hood groups, anti-poverty groups and civil rights organizations.

Eligible clients or client representatives will hold ten seats on the Board of Directors. An individual is eligible for legal services if she or he ears \$3,713.00 or less. Chient representatives to the Board must represent organizations composed of eligible clients.
