The goal of current law and the goal of this Bill is compliance. We do not seek to cut off payment of federal funds. We prefer that the funds be used as intended. Suspension and termination are last steps. But, we have to be willing to use the last steps before the first steps become meaningful.

There are criminal penalties in the statues for embezzling federal funds. We have thousands of auditors, backed up by the FBI if need be, to catch embezzlers, but if someone uses

be, to catch embezzlers, but if someone uses federal money to embezzle someone's civil rights, there are no criminal penalties; no civil

penalties; and we continue to pay the money.

We should not be allowed to compromise commitment to the people's civil rights. Ig-noring the rights of some undermines the rights of all. If the administration of the law fails to protect the rights of all, it is Congress duty to rewrite the law. It is not the Executive's duty to decide through neglect whose rights shall be protected and whose rights shall be
