Two losses against two of the top NAIA teams in Oklahoma dropped Langston's record to 2-2 on the season.

The Lions and Ladies hit the road for a spell before playing in front of the home folks again, the Lions on the road until December 13 when they face Lincoln, Mo. in C. F. Gayles Gym and the Ladies on the road until January.

The Lions face University of Science and Arts Thursday then travel on to Dallas for the Bishop, Texas tournament Friday and

Saturday.

Part of coach Lawrence Cudjoe's problems were solved over the weekend when Earl Mitchell, a 6-4 by 270 pound center made his debut in the Lion lineup.

"He's going to help us tremendously in the middle," Cudjoe said. Mitchell did just that in his second game Saturday by grabbing 14 rebounds against Bethany Nazarene. Mitchell, a senior from Detroit, Texas, was starting defensive tackle for the Lion football team.

"We still need a big center with lots of offensive potential," Cudjoe said. "Our guards have to carry the load and so far are doing a fair job."

Leonard Tomlinson, a 6-4 sophomore from Washington, D.C. leads the Lions with an 18.3 scoring average and 10 rebounds a game. Jeffrie Hooper, a 5-8 sophomore from El Reno leads the Ladies with a 18.0 average.


