


The Rebels won the Holiday Classic 94-85 over UC Santa Barbara. This was the sixth straight time the Rebels had won the Classic and raises the Rebels to a 13-0 season record, and the 71st straight home game.

Reggie Theus was selected the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Earl Evans and "Wild Willard" Govain joined him on the six member All-tournament squad. Clint Richardson of Seatle University; Paul Cathey of Gonzaga; and Jeff Perry of UCSB were the three remaining members selected for the three remaining members selected for

the All-tournament squad.

Tarkanian said, "I thought that for 30 minutes we played the best ball of the season. We played as well as we can play. We moved well offensively and had good shot selection. We played good defense, too. But we got up by 25 points and then we got very selfish and played as individuals. Things seemed so well in hand as UNLV

ran up its large lead that Theus, during an official's time out, sat on the press table, rather than stay on the court.

It was a rough game at times. Both Govain and Robinson went down after catching an elbow accidentaly thrown in their faces.

UNLV hit 54.7 percent and UCSB 61.4 percent from the floor.

Theus led all scorers with 26. Other with double figures were: Robinson, 15; Evans 14; Smith 13; and Gerald Sims 10. Evans led with 15 rebounds and Robinson had 10. Many of the fans booed when Theus was named the MOP; they felt Evans should have been the one named.

UCSB coach Ralph Barkey said, "I was very pleased with our play in the second half. We didn't lose our dignity. We didn't control the tempo in the first half as we should have. We didn't respond to their double-team defense and that was the difference. We let them take it away from us."
