UNLV rternship

Four business majors at the University

of Nevada, Las Vegas left their school desks recently for a 12-week preview of their futures in the real world of high finance.

They are the first interns in a new program administered by the UNLV finance department within the College of Business and Economics. The internships are desgined

and Economics. The internships are desgined to place students in positions of responsibility with businesses throughout Nevada.

"Because of the success of this pilot program we will be expanding it to 20 interns this summer," said Dr. Delmar D. Hartley, acting chairman of the finance department. "We make it very clear from the beginning that these students are not go-fers. Each student is assigned a project by the sponsoring firm which, when completed, should have a specific impact on the operation of that business.

Two of the interns, who graduated this month, secured full-time jobs as a direct result of their internships. Jim Pettis, a finance major, was hired by Professional Advisory Services, the firm where he served his internship; and Debbie Lloyd, who interned with the Bank of Nevada, is now employed by Nevada Power Company.

Professional Advisory Services, consultant in risk management, advises companies and public entities on how to cut insurance costs by identifying risks and implementing safety controls. As an intern Pettis prepared a statistical survey of all state and local entities, compiling a list of the number and types of claims.

Lloyd, a management major, rewrote the Bank of Nevada's Salary Administration and Job Description Manual. The two-volume manual is now being used by the bank's personnel department.

The other two interns, Russell Foreman and Jim Russell, also interned at the Bank of Nevada and still work there on a parttime basis. Foreman performed operational analyses of various departments in the bank, and Russell designed and implemented a probate procedure for the trust department.
