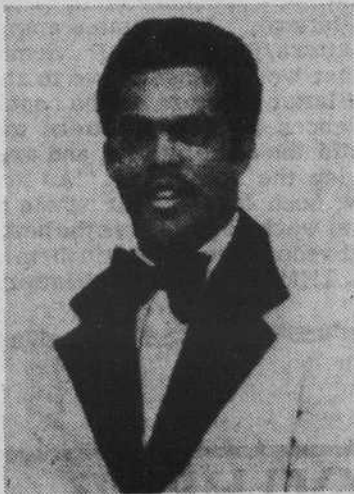
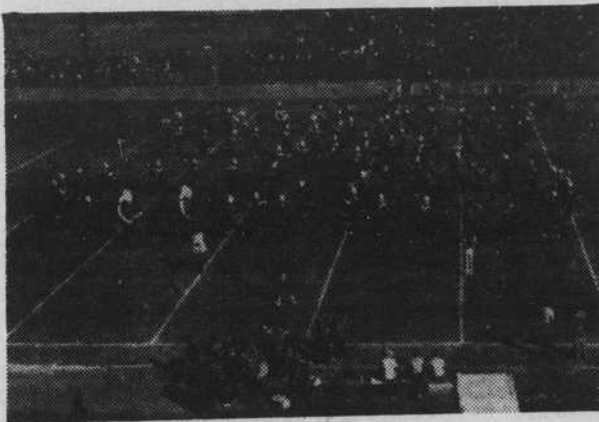
The Honor Chorus was directed by Mrs. Grace McGlothen and the band was directed by Mr. Bill Hart, both eminent in their own rights.

We welcome Mr. McMosley to the Las Vegas Community.



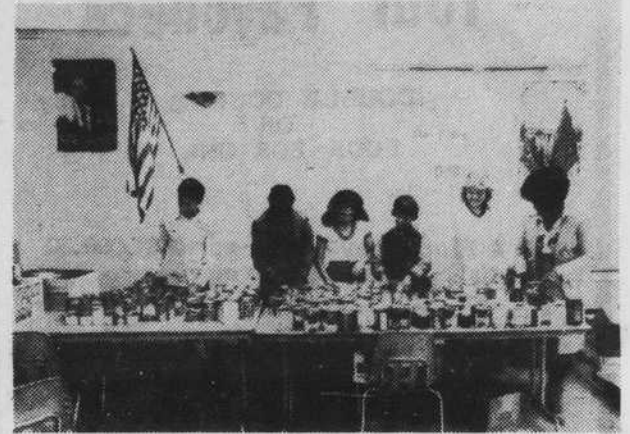
