

### High School Basketball

Las Vegas High beat Rancho High 96-81,

Saturday night.

This win puts Las Vegas High, 2-1, in sole possession of second place in the Sunrise Division behind leader Western High, while Rancho High, now 1-2, falls into third. Rancho's Hal Welch scored 33 points to Las Vegas' Freddie Thompson's 29 to win

the battle, but Las Vegas won the war.
The two teams traded baskets to start the fourth period. Rancho could only close to within 10 points despite Thompson having to leave the game after his fifth foul. Las Vegas then ran off 10 straight points to take 90-70 lead and coasted the rest of the way with reserves.

Also on Saturday night, Gorman beat Clark 64-57. Danny Tarkanian led with 18 points; Mike Brown also had 18 points; and Ricardo Hawkins had 14.
