





The Rebels lost their third straight game

The Rebels lost their third straight game Saturday night to Wichita State 87-83. UNLV has lost four of their last five games, and now has a 15-4 season record. The Rebels led in the opening minute of the contest, but never again. The largest lead by Wichita State was 11 points, with 13:29 left in the game. "We missed at least 10 layups that would have won the game handily for us. I just can't believe it. I thought we had good shots," said Tarkanian. "We shot 50 percent for the game, but they got the key rebounds time and again. We're still rushing our shots underneath. WSU is not that big and our kids have been playing against taller shots underneath. WSU is not that big and our kids have been playing against taller players and have been having to rush their shots somewhat. They didn't have to tonight, but they did." Smith led UNLV with 20 points; Sims followed with 19; Evans was next with 17 points; Theus, 11 points; and Robinson had 10. Evans led all players with 17 rebounds. Wichita State coach Harry Miller made a defensive change at halftime. "We moved our guards out a little futher to take Sim's shot away." Miller couldn't stop Smith, how-ever, who was bombing away the entire
