During the clients 7th month of pregnancy the clients are transferred to the OB/GYN Resident at Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital for the remainder of their pregnancy and are responsible for paying their pre-natal visits and hospital bill. The Economic Opportunity Board is responsible for the clients postpartum care six weeks after
