1. QUESTION: How many officers and directors do we need?

ANSWER: SBA recommends seven officers and directors.

2. QUESTION: Can a loan be made to assist an SBC which is a non-profit corporation?

ANSWER: Not if the SBC is a charitable institution or other non-profit enterprise; however, this provision shall not be construed to bar a loan to a cooperative if it carries on a business activity for the purpose of obtaining pecuniary benefits for its members in the operation of otherwise eligible small business. Consumer cooperatives are not eligible.

3. QUESTION: How much money can a LDC make on its injection in a project?
ANSWER: The LDC can make a reasonable return on its investment in the project. In computing the monthly payment to SBA/LDC, the LDC can charge a small monthly fee for servicing the loan and can provide for a contigency reserve if necessary, subject to SBA approval.

4. QUESTION: Can the LDC own the SBC? ANSWER: No. This must be a complete arm's length transaction between the LDC and the SBC. The LDC may either

own or invest in the SBC.

5. QUESTION: Can we use the city to put in the streets and sewers and call that

"in kind" injection?

ANSWER: This would depend upon the type of arrangement the SBC has with the LDC. There are five types of arrangements. They are:

a. LDC relends the money to the SBC.b. LDC leases the property to SBC with

LDC leases the property to SBC with lease-purchase option to acquire c. LDC title for \$1.00 at the end of the term.

d. LDC leases the property to SBC on a straight lease. e. LDC sells the property to SBC sub-
