Katherine Hepburn Film Festival

The Clark County Library presents KATE, a three day film festival featuring the best of Katherine Hepburn. Scheduled at 2 p.m. Sunday, February 19th and 7 p.m. February 20th and 21st, the films include "Sylvia Scarlet" (1936), "Adam's Rib" (1949) and "Desk Set" (1957).

Kate's roles in the three films are basically similar, only the details are re-arranged. Kate and Cary Grant become involved with a group of London vagabonds; Kate and Tracy are pitted against one another across the counsel tables and Kate, a walking catalog of information competes with Tracy's "vile" computer.

If it is possible for any person to be a legend in his own time, Katherine Hepburn qualifies. If it is possible for movie heroines to be spirited, gracious, intelligent and a match for any man, then Kate invented the part. If it is possible that older gets better, then Kate's career is a perfect example.

Katherine Hepburn is no middle-ground actress - you either can't stand her or you are addicted. Critics have labeled her haughty, mannered and stuck in the same role. She is guilty on all three counts, for Kate is KATE. A good actor brings something of himself to every role, focusing on that which is common to themselves and the character, bringing believability to the role.

Perhaps the most outstanding traits that Kate brings to her characters are humor and dignity - two of the best human attributes. Sometimes the dignity is disguised as pride - which usually falleth before Tracy. The humor is either a mile-a-minute, tender and teasing or chin-in-the-air caustic. Whatever the film, it is always a treat to watch Kate play Kate.

WORKSHOP

Family involvement is the topic for the third in a series of workshop on young handicapped children being conducted Feb. 24 and 25 at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

The workshop will feature Louise Phillips, director of home and school services for Magnolia Public Schools in Magnolia, Ark., who will emphasize family involvement in the education of young handicapped children.

The UNLV workshop will cover parent communication with children, parent power, parent and professional interaction and coordinating community resources for families.

All workshop sessions will be held in the College of Education Auditorium on Campus. Registration is from 7 to 7:30 p.m. Friday. First-day session continues until 10 p.m.

Saturday's program begins at 9 a.m. and continues until 4:45 p.m. Admission is free.

Phillips has been with the Magnolia schools since 1950 and has served in a variety of supervisory and administrative positions. In addition to teaching at seven different universities, she has conducted many workshops and has written 12 grants for early childhood special education programs.

She also has served as a consultant and field reader for the Bureau of Education for the Handicapped, U.S. Office of Education. She has worked with the federal government's Handicapped Children's Early Education Program since its inception in 1968.

The handicapped children workshop series is sponsored by Project FAITH, a federally-funded project designed to provide model demonstration services to handicapped infants and toddlers in southern Nevada. Dr. Nasim Dil, infant program coordinator for Project FAITH at UNLV, is coordinator of the workshop.
