In the final three rounds Spinks just had "more left" and his constant job to Ali's arms and shoulders had made Ali armweary. It was Sam Solomon's strategy to wear down Ali's arms with the steady flow of jobs to the shoulder. Apparently it worked. Sam Solomon is Spinks trainer and has said all along that "Leon would beat Ali."

Chet Cummings, Spinks public relations man, was sure Spinks would win. When contacted by phone after the fight, he said, "What did I tell you?" Chet had devised a sign stating "Ali is the Greatest - Spinks is the Latest, which just goes to show he knew what he was talking about.

Jimmy Young told the press, "One more round and I think he (Spinks) would have knocked Ali out. I really didn't want to see him go out that way. I think he should have quit."

Spinks win marks the first championship to change hands via a decision since Jimmy Braddock took the title from Max Baer on June 13, 1935.

The Spinks-Ali fight closed perhaps the best boxing card ever put together.
Danny "Little Red" Lopez successfully defended his World Boxing Council fea-therweight championship with a six-round knockout of David "Poison" Kotey.

Mike Spinks made all this a family matter by beating his opponent, Tom "the Bomb" Bethea, in an eight round preliminary. It was a unanimous decision, but was probably the most difficult 40-32

score Mike will ever earn.

Mike knows now, that winning a pro
fight is much more difficult than an Olympic middleweight title. However, now that Mike knows it can be done, he just might join his brother on the top of the world.

Promoter Bob Arum now appears to control the big title and wouldn't mind adding the lightheavyweight championship. Mike wouldn't mind obliging and there has never been a brother act on top in the two divisions. But then, there has never been a brother combination quite like the Spinks.
