There are those who preach to black America that all is well. There are those blacks themselves who feel that their personal good fortune is universal for black people. We are seeing this all perpetuate an aura of good times while the stark reality of all too many people borders upon desperation. The true facts are far worse than the false sense of well being that some seek to peretuate.

Over the past year, while the white unemployment rate declined from 7.3% to 6.4%, the jobless rate among blacks remained close to 14% according to Labor Department statistics. Among black youths, the rate was 35.6%, compared to 17.3% for whites.

I cannot stress strongly enough that Labor Department statistics don't give the true unemployment picture. This is true because the Labor Department statistics only deal with those people who are still registered in pur-suit of jobs. The statistics donot report at all, those who have dropped out of the job market out of despair or for other reasons. That means that thousands of people are not listed in those statistics who are without a job.

The statistics donot reflect those who are

under-employed are employed partime. They give a distorted picture that is better than the

situation really is.

Reliable sources who are concerned with the true plight of the black unemployed reveal that black unemployment is closer to 20%. That means one of five blacks is unemployed. The same sources estimate that the unemployment of black youth is over 50%. Some communities are said to have a black unemployment

rate of close to 80%.

This is shocking and shameful. Yet it is met by responses from white and corporate America and strangely by some blacks who have access to media projection with a reactionary attitude that blames blacks themselves for the deplorable employment situa-

tion.

Such people have interupted their cries of how good it is to screams of how bad and how lazy blacks are.

The true facts are that from 1974 to 1976, the median income for black families, when adjusted for inflation, remained at \$9,242, while the white median income for whites rose slightly from \$15,478 to \$15,537. Whites with high school educations still receive more

income than blacks with a college degree.

It is dangerous to continue to deal with the cumulative arithmetic of Labor Department statistics to the detriment of the human arithmetic of the full picture. We hear much talk about balancing the budget and control-ing inflation. Those are real issues but not at the expense of the lives of so many black hum an beings.

We cannot excuse questionable behavior but we still must realize that much of the behavior that is criticized on the part of blacks, results form the frustration and desperation of the unemployed. The murder, the bloodshed, the mayhem, narcotics and other maladies that runs rampant in so many black communities, is in part but not totally, due to the dire employment situation.

Something must be done to solve this sut-uation because we are again creating the type of powder keg that erupted in the mid-sixtles. People ignored the warnings of the sixties.

They are ignoring the warnings now. A few weeks ago I advocated the passage of the Humphrey-Hawkins bill as a eulogy in memory of Senator Hubert Humphrey. I still advocate passage of that bill. The bills passage would be a beginning but would not begin

to totally solve the problem.

America needs a new and visionary approach to the job situation. It must reflect the full human needs of the people. If not, it will not be enough whatever it is.


