### Basketball

Rancho beat Clark 65-59 in the first round of the Southern AAA zone Tournament at the Las Vegas Convention Center; while Gorman rolled over Basic 74-50; Valley took Eldorado 76-35; and Western topped Bonanza 80-56.

Fuller (Rancho) wound up with 19 points. The Rams finished with a 37% effort from the floor compared to 41% for the Chargers. Rancho connected on 17 of 26 free throws while Clark made seven of 10 attempts.

Jackson (Valley) poured in 27 points hitting 10 of 15 from the field and seven from the line, picked off seven rebounds also. Valley hit 43% from the floor while Eldorado suffered with 31% shooting. Brown (Basic) scored 28 points and topped everyone with 22 rebounds. Hawkins (Gorman) had 13 points and 12 rebounds. Gorman coach Bob Vrown admitted his club didn't play very well. Gorman only out rebounded Basic 50-49, and committed almost as many turnovers as Basic.

Western had little trouble disposing of Bonanza, giving Western a 17-10 record for the season and Bonanza a 8-21 record. Krenzien (Western) led all players with 22 points and had 10 rebounds; Hicks had 14 points and 12 rebounds; Macklin, Ormund and Busch each added 10 points.

added 10 points. Spedman (Bonanza had 16 points and 14 rebounds; Mike Dunson 15 points.

In the second round Gorman beat Rancho 76-71 in the best played game of the tournament to this point. Valley beat Western 79-52. This gives Gorman and Valley the two other remaining berths for next week's state tournament in Reno. Wester shot only 31% from the floor and top-gun Willie Hicks and Mickey Ormond combined for a 13 for 40 performance.

Gorman topped Las Vegas 75-70 in double overtime while Chaparral beat Valley 61-59.

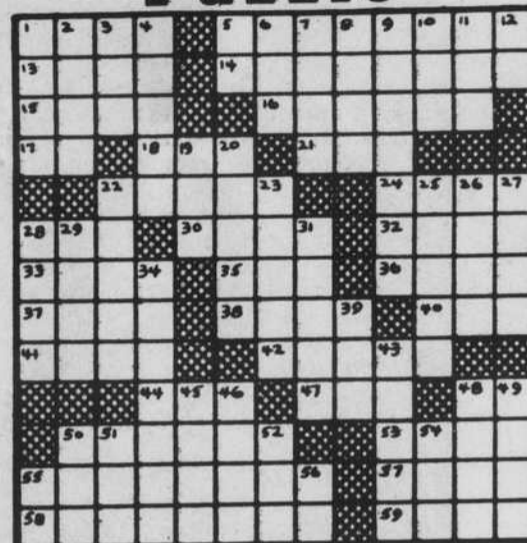
Fred Thompson (Las Vegas) scored 31 points and had 11 rebounds. Mike Brown (Gorman) had 19 points and 1 rebound. This is the third time this season the Cowboys have beaten the Vikings.

Chaparral beat Gorman 63-61 and took the zone title in overtime.

Chaparral will be top seeded in next weeks state tournament in Reno and will be slotted into the semi-finals of the three-day affair. Gorman will be the Souths #2 team; Valley is in #3 slot from the South; while Las Vegas is #4.

The Las Vegas Valley game looked like a contest where both teams realized nothing much was at stake. It was a sloppy-played flat game for both teams. "It was your typical consolation game. Both teams were complacent. The only time either team played with any spirit was when it was close," said victorious Valley coach Bob Bobier.

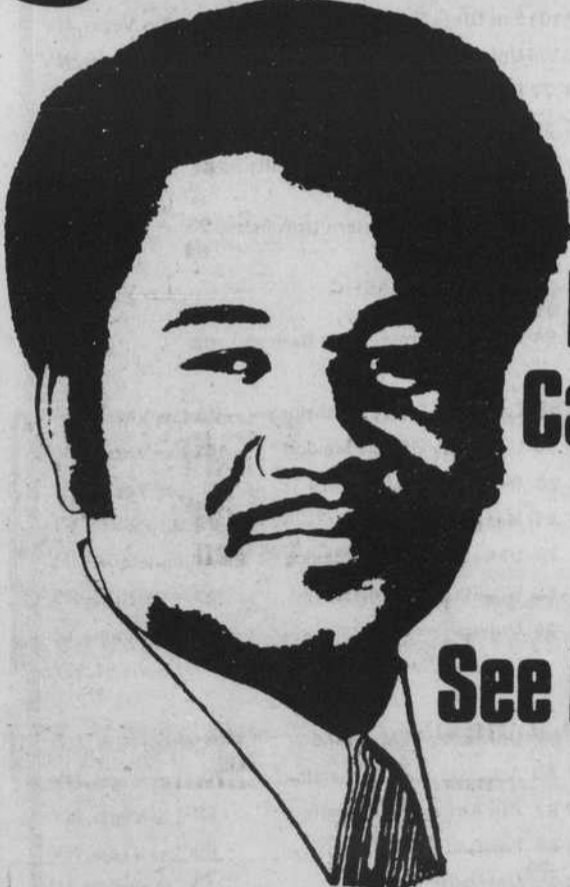
