


ROBERT L. REID

1. "Trust and obey." Many of us know the hymn which reminds us to "trust and obey; for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus but to trust and obey."


Those who live their lives . "in Jesus" with trust and obedience are always people who have reason to be happy. They are people who can...

### DANIEL "CHAPPIE" JAMES, JR.

New York -- The NAACP this week mourned the death of Air Force General Daniel "Chappie' James, Jr., the highest ranking black military officer, who often proudly recalled his ties with the Association and the help that the civil rights organization gave him throughout his career.

Only last summer, the NAACP presented Gen. James the Association's Armed Services and Veterans Meritorious Service Award at the Annual Convention in Stl Louis.

During the Mississippi boycott crisis in 1976, Gen. Davis recalled in an affidavit the extent of the NAACP's support, which was crucial to his historical rise. This affidavit helped buttress the NAACP's appeal to the U. S. District Court in Mississippi for a reduction of the \$2.6 million bond that the Association had initially been required to post

under state law.

The following is the text of the NAACP's message of condolence to Mrs. James, which was from Mrs. Margaret Bush Wilson, chairman, Dr. W. Montague Cobb, president, and Benjamin L. Hooks, executive director: "We of the National Association for the

Advancement of Colored People deeply regret the death of your beloved and distinguished husband who was our esteemed friend. His was a singular career of accomplishment. During three and one-half decades he passed many milestones climaxed by the final distinction of serving as United States Air Force Com-mander-in-Chief North American Air Defense Command. He leaves an unique re-cord of which we are justly proud. We join you in mourning his loss and extend our profound sympathy."
