SNEDC Receives Assistance Gran

Reno, NV 89507 A check for \$30,000 was presented today to the Board of Directors of the Southern Nevada Economic Development Council by Governor Mike O'Callaghan. The check is the first payment of a Four Corners Regional Commission technical assistance grant. The full grant is \$82,000 and according to O'Callaghan "the money will be used for the on-going economic development of the West Las Vegas community."

Through previous grant money from Four Corners Regional Commission and through the efforts of Otis Harris an Overall Economic Development Plan was established for the Westside community to help provide more and better employment and assist industry desiring to locate in the area. The additional grant money will implement this plan.


