A grant of \$5,000 from Diamond's was presented to the City Spirit Coalition for a cultural planning project this week in Las Vegas. Ralph Plotkin, Diamond's Vice-President, presented the donation to Las Vegas Mayor Bill Briare, who accepted the corporate gift on behalf of the City Spirit Coalition project. The presentation Ceremony was hosted by the Nubian Kefentse Kultural Kommunity by the Nubian Kefentse Kultural Kommunity Center.

The grant to the City Spirit Coalition was made possible by a contribution to the Dayton Hudson Foundation from Diamond's an operating company of the Dayton Hudson Corporation, Glenn E. Hohnson, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer. Diamond's Corporate policy, which emphasizes a strong obligation to serve local communities in which it is operative, has long been recognized for outstanding responsiveness to the arts and social needs on a national level.

The Diamond's grant will be utilized, along with City funding of \$5,000 cash and \$5,000 in-kind to match a \$15,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts under the Endowment's City Spirit program. Funding for the City Spirit Coalition project will support a broad based cultural planning pro-

ject to focus on assessing the cultural needs

of the West Las Vegas community, while broadening the role of the arts in the Las Vegas Valley.

The City Spirit Coalition, an ad hoc organization of local arts agencies includes the City Cultural and Community Affairs Branch of the Department of Recreation and Leisure Activities, the Southern Nevada Allied Arts Council the Las Vegas Jazz Society, D-Street Plus, the Nubian Kefentse Kultural Community, Bold Explosion, Inc. and the Westside Community Comprehensive Economic Development Plan. The one year cultural planning project, for which the City serves as fiscal agent, will

for which the City serves as fiscal agent, will be implemented to two phases under the direction of the City Spirit Coalition.

The planning project is the result of cooperative community efforts throughout the past year. In June of 1977, Lois McGuire, NEA City Spirit facilitator visited the Las Vegas community under the sponsorship of six community arts agencies. Shortly after the facilitation process, the City Spirit Coalition was itation process, the City Spirit Coalition was established for the purpose of developing a proposal to the National Endowment for the Arts which would provide a broad-based cultural planning effort.

The first phase of the City Spirit project will combine a variety of techniques to assess community needs, encourage citizen input and identify possible resources which already exist. Phase two of the project will emphasize the development of action plans to address cultural needs of the West Las Vegas

community.

A series of demonstration projects will be used during the second phase to test ways of realizing those cultural needs identified. Such demonstration projects may include festivals, children's programs and professional artists' workshops. A portion of the Diamond's grant will allow the addition of one major demonstration project to the year-long program.

The City Spirit project promises to have a significant effect on cultural development in Las Vegas. The combined efforts of business, government and the community already demonstrate a promising beginning.
