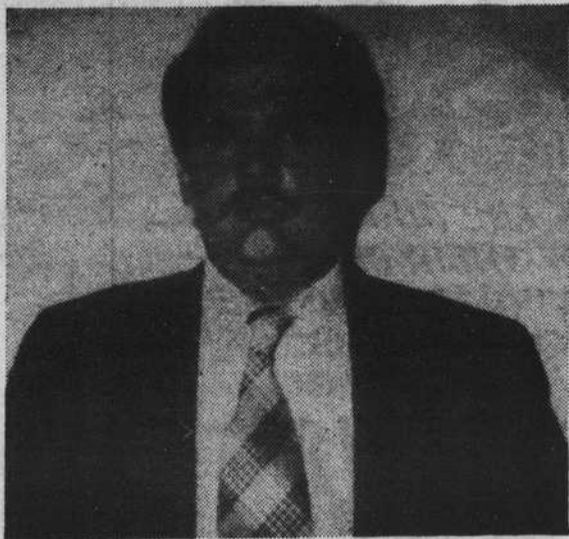

Nyberg Running for Justice of the Peace



Las Vegas Justice Court has a back log of cases and as a result gives away revenue.

When the Las Vegas Justice Court announced that they would suspend the bench warrants of 16,000 traffic violators if they paid their fines within 10 days, it was in actuality announcing that due to a back log of cases they were approving traffic violators that do not pay their traffic fines even so far as having bench warrants issued which cost the county and citizens monies in preparation.

Why is there a backlog of cases? The Justice of the Peace is an elected position and as such the person elected to this position must represent the populace who placed the individual in this position full time.

It is my contention that a Justice of the Peace is not working full time when morning court hours are from 9:30 AM to 11:30 AM and the afternoon court hours are from 1:30 PM to 3:30 PM. A total of four hours work for eight hours pay.

I believe that Justice Court should start

at 8:30 AM and stay in continuous session until 12:00 Noon, reconvening at 1:00 PM promptly, continuing until 6:30 PM in the evening. This schedule would prevent the Justice Court Backlog and permit the citizen time in court without penalizing him/her more than the offense should be due to loss of income.

I am very happy to announce that my brother, Ron Nyberg, has been appointed as my campaign chairman. 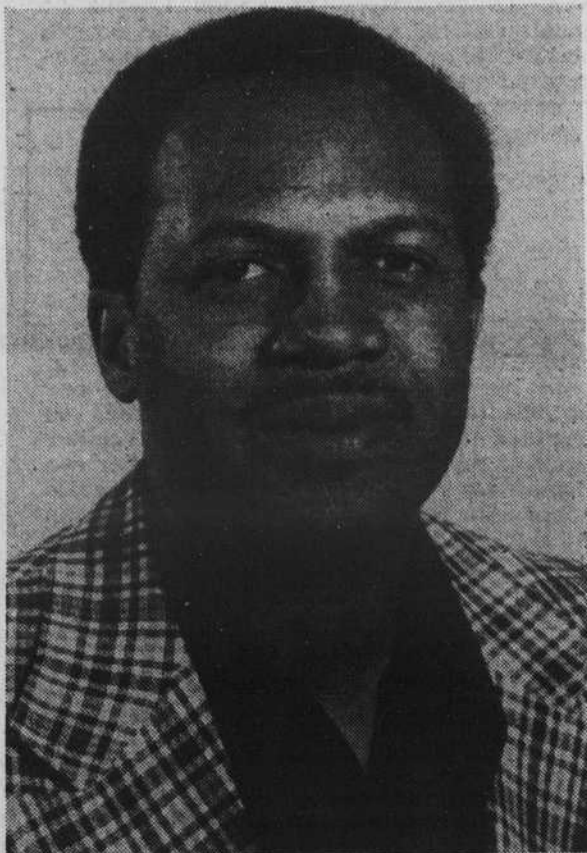

Dr. Lonnie Sisson, local Optometrist, has been nominated for the position of Director with the American Society of Planning Official. He is a former chairman of the Clark County Planning Commission and has served on that board for the past five years.

Dr. Sisson is a graduate of Pacific University, Forest Grove, Oregon. He is a member of the Southern Nevada Executive Council, The Southern Nevada Economic Development Council, the National Planning Association as well as several professional organizations. He is a former faculty member of the New England College of Optometry.

In his position statement, Dr. Sisson States that "Living in the Southwest, which has great potential for expansion, as well in a community that is growing rapidly, I see the need for positive planning and development in order to maintain our natural resources, to be economically sound, and to provide practical direction to the people in the community. As a lay person, I feel that I can bring the board good insight on the dynamics of expansion."

Dr. Sisson further feels that "We need to move away from reaction toward planning, from obsolete thinking to innovative attitudes and more creative solutions to our problems. There is a great need for establishing proper public relations methods that will enable us to be closer both to the problems of the governmental decisions affecting planning and the problems of the people so that we can assist better in all levels of Development."
