The first of several events leading up to the 1978 Miss Black Teenager of Las Vegas Pageant, June 24th, has been announced by Pageant Director Al Brown. The "Spring Extravaganza, and Disco Dance" featuring the local modeling group "Koza," is scheduled for April 15th, 7:00 p.m., at the Las Vegas Convention Center, South Hall, Room 'C', according to Brown. Human Relations Coordinator for the Clark County School District, added that all proceeds from this and other pageant-related events, will be used to finance the Miss Black Teenager Pageant.

The talented group of young women comprising "Koza" includes: 13 models, a modeling coordinator, and a commentator. They have all finished modeling courses, and are proficient in most aspects of personal grooming as well as fashion coordination. "Koza" models will be showing fashions donated for the occasion by several local boutiques and women's clothing stores. Spring-time fashions to be featured include sportswear, casual clothes, and evening attire.

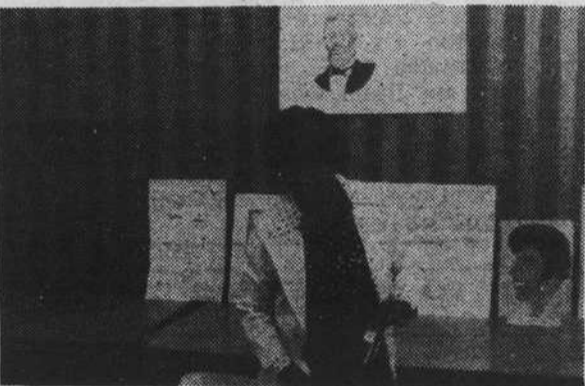
Other pageant-related events late spring include: Contestants Kick-Off Cance June 28th at the Gold Room Convention Center 8:00 - 12:00 P. M., the Donny Love Memorial Golf Tournament, named in honor of the late, outstanding Chaparral High School basketball player, to be held June 17th at the Dunes-Hotel Golf Course; The Miss Black Teenager Tennis Tournament, June 22nd and 23rd, and numerous unofficial functions for the contestants, such as an overnight camping expedition, a retreat Lee Canyon campground, barbecues, and swim parties.

Last year's winner of the Miss Black Teenager Pageant, Yolanda Brooks, will be a contestant in the Miss Black America Pageant in Pasadena, California, all expenses paid, and plans are being finalized to sponsor this year's winner in a similar national pageant.

The pageant, now in its fourth year, was started by Brown, as a vehicle of expression for Black teenage girls. From its inception, the Miss Black Teenage Pageant has been co-sponsored by the Clark County School District, in conjunction with one or more community-based organizations. This year both the Marion Bennett Youth Foundation and State Assemblyman Lonie Chaney are co-sponsors.
