The Emotions and Maze, featuring Frankie Beverly, are the star attractions this weekend on soul Train, television's syndicated showcase for musical talent.

Now at the peak of their popularity, the Hutchinson sisters, professionally known as The Emotions, harmonize most effectively on "Rejoice," the title of their second album, "Don't Ask My Neighbor" and one of their biggest hits, "Best of My Love."

Wanda, Sheila and Jeanette Hutchinson began singing at 3, 4 and 5 at the urging of father Joe, their manager. Later they were joined by younger sister, Pamela, and Brother Joe, Jr. who plays guitar and serves as trouble shooter. Jeanette no longer travels with the

trio but continues to record with them.

From their first album Maze sing "While I'm Alone" and "Lady of Magic." The 7-member band, led by Frankie Beverly, combines the best of the "Philly Sound," where they originated, with the more funky West Coast beat. The result has won and earned the encouragement and support of Marvin Gaye with whom they have toured. Their newest album "Golden Time of Day" is fast climbing the charts.

Beverly not only sings lead, but plays guitar, writes and arranges and serves as producer.
