



The Honorable Omer Salih Eissa, Sudan's Ambassador to the United States, took formal divelivery of new advanced model Lockheed C-130H Hercules transport in a ceremony at the Lockheed-Georgia Company near Atlanta. Immediately following the turnover cermony, the propjet transport was taken to the air on its 6,900-mile ferry flight to Khartoum. The delivery -- the 1500th aircraft in Lockheed's Hercules series -- marked a world aviation record for an aircraft of its type. Sudan is the 43rd nation to take delivery of the four-propjet workhorse, and will receive a total of six of rugged propjets. Since making deliveries of the first operational C-130s to the U.S. Air Force in late 1956, Lockheed has delivered 998 Hercules to U.S. ser-



vices, 433 to intermational governments and 69 "stretched" commercial aircraft to domedtic/and international operators. The worldwide Hercules fleet has accumulated more than 12 million flight hours -- the equivalent of more than 6,400 round trips between the earth and moon. Lockheed continues to build the Hercules at the rate of three per month at its plant in Georgia. In photo above, Ambassador Eissa is pictured (left photo) looking over the plane's flight station.
